MILESTONE

7723 Goulburn Valley Highway, Kialla

As you roll into Shepparton, it's hard to miss Milestone Cafe, adjacent to the Dutch windmill that the Chocolate Apple Factory now calls home. This aptly motoring named café is just next door to MOVE. Stretch your legs, and make yourself at home for a morning tea break where you can enjoy modern Australian fare and quality coffee. Kristofer Bech Howley and his partner Chia-Hua Lee have created a modern Australian menu covering all your favourite bases plus a sprinkle of S.E. Asian fusion.

Works from local artists are a regular addition to the cafes walls.

MOVE

7723 Goulburn Valley Highway, Kialla

Powerful engines, polished chrome and all manner of vehicles from yesteryear take pride and place at the Museum of Vehicle Evolution (MOVE). 9,000 square meters of indoor and outdoor exhibitions will take you on an exploration of vehicular advancement through the ages. MOVE more than vehicles, learn the history of iconic local family the Furphy's in The Furphy Museum. Explore 200 years of Australian fashion through the Loel Thomson Costume Collection, with the display of over 7,500 of objects. A collection that intimately reveals the social history of everyday, with pieces reflecting not just the fashion, but the life and times of the people that wore them.

SHEPPARTON ART MUSEUM

530 Wyndham Street, Shepparton

The striking new Shepparton Art Museum building that takes pride of place at the South Eastern corner of Victoria Park Lake.

Architecturally designed by Denton Corker Marshall and opened to the public in 2021, the building stretches over five levels and provides striking views, including a publicly accessible outdoor terrace at level 4.

HERITAGE WALK Welsford Street, Shepparton

(allow 15 - 40 minutes)

Stretch your legs and unearth some of the history of Shepparton & Goulburn Valley as you make your way to dinner. The Shepparton Heritage Walk takes you 1.5 kilometres along Welsford Street, from the Northern Car Park at Victoria Park Lake to the Queens Gardens, past some sites of historical significance to Shepparton.

The walk includes three of the Aboriginal Street Art Project Murals, Shepparton's Oldest remaining building, the Joseph Furphy Monument, Shepparton Memorial Park, Sir Murray Bourchier and William Cooper memorial statues.

DAY 2 **SHEPPARTON**



ERS STREET FOOD STRIP

Fryers Street, Shepparton (4 minute drive or 16 minute walk from The Carrington)

Fryers Street is known as the Eat Street in Shepparton. Home to flavours from across the world, there are no shortage of dining options. Wander from the Milkbar Café with the iconic Galah sculpture, by Tank, atop the building at the east, to the Fryers Street Food Store at the western end of Fryers Street. Along the way you'll discover Belcibo's, Fryers Café, Brother Pablo, Lemon Tree and Café 88 to name a few.

STREET ARTFryers Street & Maude Street Shepparton
Delve deeper into the <u>Aboriginal Street Art murals</u>, with the original two murals by Adnate.

MOOOVING ART

Monash Park, Shepparton (2 minute walk from the Stay the Duck at Home

Over 95 painted lifesized fiberglass cows make up the Moooving Art exhibition, each cow depicting a different story. They are spread across
Shepparton & Goulburn Valley, with the largest
collection in Monash Park.

Accessible 24/7.

SHEPPARTON TOWER

8 Fraser Street, Shepparton (7 minute walk from Monash Park) The Tower stands 76.2m tall with a viewing platform at 35 metres high. Offering 360 degree views over the city. 160 steps over 8 flights of stairs.

DAY 2 (cont.) SHEPPARTON

LITTLE LIPARI

143 Maude Street, Shepparton (4 minute walk from the Shepparton Tower)

A taste of Italy in the heart of Shepparton – Nestled in the CBD at the west end of Edward Street lies the innocuous Sicilian eatery Little Lipari, where Leanne and the Little Lipari family host diners for a lively and authentic Italian dining experience. With menus shaped by Leanne's heritage and local Italian style wines on the menu, you will be deliciously transported by the flavour.

Open for breakfast & lunch Monday to Saturday, and Dinner on Friday nights only, bookings are essential. Phone 0407 501 497.



THE FLATS ABORIGINAL HISTORICAL WALK

Between Shepparton & Mooroopna Park at Chainman's Bridge carpark and walk 800 metres east to the start of the walk. Alternatively park at Kidstown and walk 1.2kms to the west to the start of the walk.

(6 minute drive to Chinaman's Garden carpark from Kaiela Arts, followed by an 8 minute walk)

Follow the footsteps of past Yorta Yorta Elders as you visit <u>The Flats</u> on the floodplain between Shepparton and Mooroopna.

Interpretive signage provides a history of the significant site as you navigate the paths along the walk.

Accessible 24/7. Self-guided walk is free. Guided tours on Country require bookings in advance through Yorta Yorta Nation.

KAIELA ARTS TURTLE MAKING

Ground floor SAM Precinct, lake side 530 Wyndham Street, Shepparton (4 minute drive from Little Lipari)

<u>Kaiela Arts</u> strengthens the local indigenous community by awaking culture, learning from our past and empowering future generations.

Kaiela Arts offers a range of workshops including: turtle making, painting and weaving. Allow an hour and a half for a workshop. Or purchase take home turtle making kits for yourself or loved ones.

Turtle making kits \$16 each. Open 10am – 4pm weekdays and 10am – 3pm Saturdays. (Closed Tuesdays and Sundays).



PLAY LIKE A LOCAL: Sangi Rag is a traditional Afghan game which involves throwing rocks at a target from a distance.

PHO VIET

247 Wyndham Street, Shepparton (6 minute drive from Chinaman's Garden Carpark)

Treat yourself to a healthy and delicious feast of authentic <u>Vietnamese</u> for dinner, dine in or takeaway. The wide array of flavours and harmonious balance of taste are defining characteristics. The sticky rice dishes are delightful, and the Hà Nội spring rolls are menu favourite.

Meals are very generous in size and reasonably priced, BYO licence.

DAY 3 SHEPPARTON



BOTANIC GARDENS

Botanic Gardens Avenue, Kialla formerly Kialla Tip Road (5 minute drive from The Carrington)

Start your day with a morning stroll to the top of the <u>Australian Botanic Gardens Shepparton</u>. Catch the golden morning sun, and weave your way through a botanical representation of Shepparton's history and heritage, with the Food, Refugee and Weaving gardens telling the stories of industry, migration and culture. Traverse the boardwalk to the Children's Garden where upcycled iron sculptures make a striking display.

Once the Kialla Tip, now a picture of beauty and new life.

Accessible 24/7.





At the Botanic Gardens Keep an eye out for wildflowers during the spring and summer, with fragrant vanilla lilies, paper daisies and billy buttons visible in the forest setting.

DAY TRIP

Now it's time to choose your own adventure. Will you head east to the quintessential back road locality of Dookie. A creative community nestled amongst the Dookie Hills. Or will you take the south west loop to Murchison, Tatura and Mooroopna to unearth the history of the war time camps and cemeteries and the famous Murchison Meteorite.

Past to Present

DAY 3 (cont.) SHEPPARTON



MURCHISON | TATURA | MOOROOPNA HISTORY DRIVE

(26 minutes (35kms) drive from Botanic Gardens) (18 minutes (22kms) from Murchison to Tatura) (15 minutes (16kms) from Tatura to Mooroopna)

Stretch your legs and find your bearings in the main street of Murchison. There are many gems to unearth: At Meteorite Park, immerse yourself in the history of the 1969 meteorite shower. Tucked away towards the back of Meteorite Park is the space themed Labyrinth. Head into the Heritage Centre to see a fragment of the meteorite for yourself.

Just south of town, the <u>Italian Ossario</u> and war cemetery provide a strikingly beautiful memorial to Italian Prisoners of War who died at internment camps. Grab a bite to eat at the Murchison Bakery or settle in for a long lunch at Longleat Wines (open Saturday & Sunday) before discovering the German War Cemetery in neighbouring Tatura. Tatura Irrigation and Wartime Camps Museum houses the fascinating history of the seven internment and POW camps in the area during WWII, open every day from 1pm - 3pm. Before departing town, discover more history at the Water Tower Art, by silo artist Cam Scale and Andrew Davis with their striking poppy design and portrait of Sir John Monash and the Mosaic murals in Stuart Mock Place.

As you journey back towards Shepparton, stop in at Mooroopna, pick up <u>Australia's Best Vanilla Slice</u> at North End Bakehouse newly opened Mooroopna bakery. Wander the War Memorial panels and visit the <u>Heritage Museum</u>, or <u>MEAC</u> to view their ever changing exhibitions.



A DAY WELL SPENT IN DOOKIE

(30 minutes (36kms) drive from Botanic Gardens)

An authentically original small town experience, take a stroll down the main street of Dookie, taking in the sights of the <u>Dookie Flowering Gum</u> art installation, and the interestingly upcycled art on wheels the <u>Dookie Nomadic Silos</u>. This small community punches above its weight in the creative space. Get lost in the <u>Dookie Emporium</u>, which boasts an eclectic mix of antiques, furniture, collectibles & militaria. Lunch on the scrumptious Dookie burger from the General Store, or head to <u>Rye at Tallis</u> for fine dining with a view. Before taking in a gentle walk along the <u>Dookie Rail Trail</u>, or a more adventurous trek up Mount Major on the <u>Mulana Nin lyoga trail</u>.





It won't take long to understand there is so much to see, so many stories to be shared and memories made here in Shepparton & Goulburn Valley. Take a few minutes at each site, or linger longer to immerse yourself in your chosen locations.

MUSTAFAS GOZLOME

296 Wyndham Street, Shepparton (6 minute drive from Mooroopna)

Turkish community have long been renowned for their warm and welcoming hospitality. With traditionally gozleme fresh from the griddle, soft pillowy house made Turkish bread and flavourful char grilled meats, settle in for a sumptuous feast like büyükanne would make at home.

STANLEY'S CAFE

48 High Street, Shepparton (5 minute drive or 12 minute walk from The Carrington)

Your host Karen 'Chuz' Resul's Albanian roots take pride and place on the Mediterranean inspired menu at Stanley's Cafe. From the moment you walk in the door, you walk into her home. Chuz has been cooking alongside her mum for over 40 years, and the passion and love shows through in the food. From the breakfast waffles to the Big Brekky, there is something for everyone tastes. Baklava, petulla (Albanian donuts), burek, lakror will also tempt your tastebuds. With records spinning a merry tune you might be

HUNT & GATHER FOR LUNCH

Vaughan Street (3 min drive or 7 min walk from Stanley's Café)

Explore the gourmet delight of Vaughan Street: Deli Europa offers a bountiful selection of local and regional gourmet products in their Mediterranean deli and cafe. Choose your own selection or be guided by knowledgeable staff in creating your own delicious meal. Compliment it with the array of seasonal fresh produce at Finer Fruit, before venturing across the street to Fiore's Bakery where you'll delight in their Italian pastries and desserts.

If you've still got space in the car, stop by <u>SPC Factory Sales</u>, a 1 minute walk from Vaughan Street. Where you will find a range of products made locally, including SPC (Shepparton Preserving Company) tinned foods, Goulburn Valley fruit products, and Campbell Soups.

DAY 4 (cont.) SHEPPARTON

CHOCOLATE APPLE FACTORY

7717 Goulburn Valley Highway, Kialla (9 minute drive from Vaughan Street)

The <u>Chocolate Apple Factory</u> takes fresh pink lady apples from the orchard, dips them in caramel and then chocolate creating the distinctive local treat. Their unique range of sweet delights also includes rocky road, chocolate coated nuts and fruit, freeze dried lollies, rock candy and more.

Chocolate Apples range from \$10 - \$16.50 Open 6 days, 10am – 3pm (closed Tuesdays).

OUR FAVOURITE: You can't go past their chocolate coated pork crackle and their chocolate coated potato chips. It's the perfect combination of sweet and savoury



CANOE THE GOULBURN

Kaieltheban Park – 7 min drive from Vaughan St Daintons Bridge – 3 min drive from Vaughan St Victoria Park Lake, Tom Collins Drive – 4 min drive from Vaughan St

If fishing isn't your thing, choose to explore the Kaiela from the water. Our river access map available at the Visitor Centre provides a range of options, and <u>Trelly's</u> offers canoe hire equipment. Our top picks are to depart from Kaieltheban Park and paddle downstream to Dainton's Bridge, or depart from Dainton's Bridge, and paddle downstream to Jordan's Bend. Alternatively park in Tom Collins drive and paddle on Victoria Park Lake (also a popular spot for stand up paddle boarding). You never know, you might get to paddle alongside locals from the <u>Shepparton Canoe Club</u>.






ARCADIA NATIVE FISH HATCHERY 200 Ross Road, Arcadia

Arcadia Fish hatchery is a tranquil location 20 minutes south of Shepparton. The newly opened native fish hatchery has an Interpretive Centre, BBQ areas, toilets and a natural playground.

Share your picnic lunch before throwing in a line in their 'fish out' pond. Providing what you catch is the legal limit, you can take it home for dinner.

If a guided fishing tour is more your style, <u>Burnanga Indigenous Fishing Club</u> provide a range of fishing tour options on Kaiela (the Goulburn River).




