EXPERIENCE

Tatura Irrigation and Wartime Camps Museum

Take the opportunity to explore the irrigation history of the Goulburn Valley, as well as the unique history of internment and POW camps from WWII. Be sure to ask about the German War Cemetery located in the Tatura area.

Victoria Cross Memorial Garden

Take a stroll around these beautiful gardens and pay tribute to Tatura's servicemen and women from both World Wars and Vietnam.

Stuart Mock Place

It's glass murals depict the history, development, and future projection of Tatura, whilst also emphasising the importance of the Sun, Earth and Water.

Tatura is well known for doubling its population each January when hosting the southern hemisphere's largest dairy show, International Dairy Week

PUBLIC ART

Tatura Water Tower

The water tower features a portrait of General Sir John Monash, a WW1 Veteran and renowned civil engineer who also designed the water tower. On the other side features a waterfall of beautiful Poppies as a tribute to the regions' significant Anzac legacy.

Find the murals located at Lake Bartlett, designed and painted by local artists and students. Make your way around the town to see more more amazing art.



SHOP

Hogan Street Tatura is where you will find a kaleidoscope of retail opportunities for you to explore. With two local supermarkets, beautiful homewares and clothing boutiques, hardware stores, award winning butchers and bakeries who supply locally made meats and produce, opportunity shops, and more. 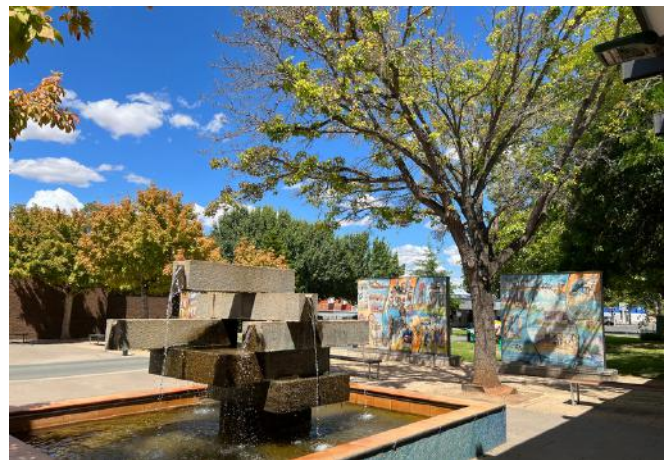
HOT TIP:

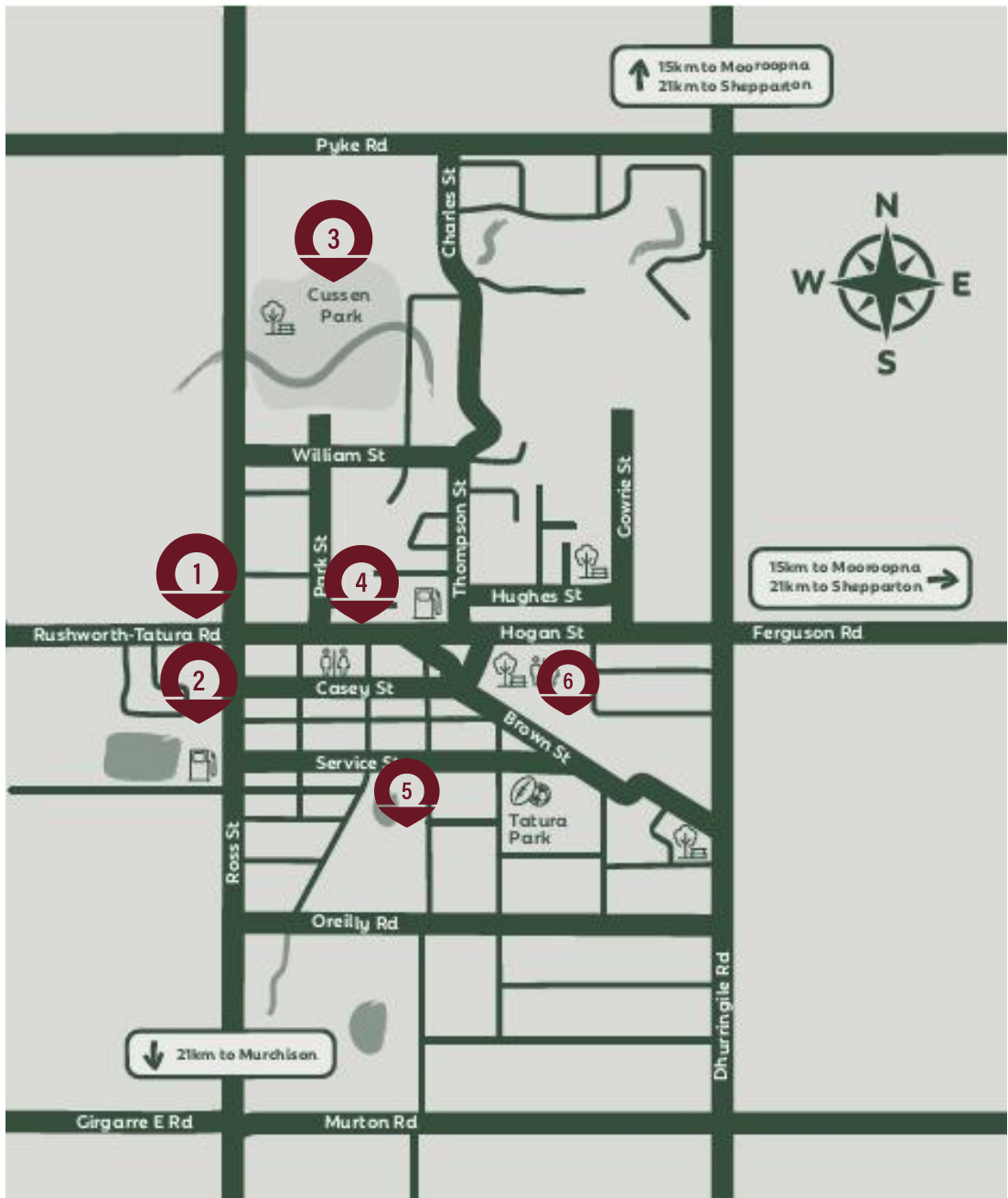


SPORTING CLUBS
