



Native Bush Basil,
Five Spice Plant
Plectranthus graveolens

Cultivation notes
Evergreen small shrub, to 1.2 m high x 1-2 m wide, native to the northeast tip of Australia to coastal hills. Prefers part shade and soil to dry out. Tolerant of coastal conditions and mild frosts. Quickly growing, best when pruned regularly to keep bushy. Pruning time: flower spikes appear throughout the year. Other members with *P. graveolens* and *P. parviflorus*.

Uses
Woody stems are strongly aromatic, with aromas of basil, mint, and sage. The young leaves fresh or dried in Mediterranean dishes, as you would basil. There will also be lemon, red berries, cinnamon, garlic, lemon-eggplant. Leaves have anti-microbial properties.
